## A new booking system for Norfolk recycling centres

A new booking system is being introduced for all Norfolk recycling centres.

From 18th November 2024 you must have booked to visit a Norfolk recycling centre.

You can book up to seven days in advance, so you will be able to book from 11th November 2024.

Each time slot is 15 minutes. You will need to arrive within the time you have booked.

There is no charge to make a booking and you can make as many bookings as you need. Charges still apply for trade waste and household DIY waste over the free limit.

You can only book one slot at a time. But as long as they are available, you can book as many slots as you need each day.

When you book you will select the recycling centre, date and time you want to visit. You will need to enter the following details:

- Your name
- Your address
- Registration number of the vehicle you will use when you visit
- Your email address
- Whether you are bringing DIY waste

You will also be able to change or cancel your booking if needed.

### Annual Free Household hazardous waste day

These are for residents disposing of hazardous household waste only. They are not for any business, group or other organisation.



# **Long Stratton Youth Activities**

Our regular Youth Café sessions continued to run throughout the summer including during the school holidays, alongside bi-weekly Junior Youth Café sessions. After what seemed like a very wet year so far, we were finally able to make use of the wider space and facilities surrounding us on the Manor Road Playing Fields and we had lots of fun in the sun playing rounders (once we could agree on the rules), table-tennis and enjoying the cool shaded area at the top of the field when it got hot but we still wanted to be outside. We also continued to enjoy a range of other activities especially making, and, most importantly, eating different types of food, including; crepes, toasties, waffles, and my personal favourite, Quesadillas (Mexican style toasted wraps). We also enjoyed listening (and sometimes singing along) to different styles of music as young people were keen to share their favourites with each other. We also found out that as well as helping us to improve our fitness and relaxation levels, yoga can also be a fun group activity, and there was lots of laugher when we played yoga games together with Chloe and Rachel from Norfolk County Council's Schools and Communities Team.

The highlight of the summer, however, were the two day trips on the Norfolk Broads that Long Stratton Youth Activities organised in partnership with The Broads Authority, to Barton Turf Activity Centre for ages 11+ and to How Hill Nature Reserve for ages 8+. Both trips were fully subscribed and we had two fantastic days out. We travelled by mini-bus as a group from The Pavilion, making the activity accessible to all young people in and around the Long Stratton area. Activities included; working as a team 'geocaching', charcoal making, canoeing, thatching and enjoying a boat trip on the Broads.












We have now streamlined our Youth Café sessions on Wednesdays from 3.30-5.30pm for all young people in school years 7+ and have trialled an evening session during half-term on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> October from 7.15 -8.45pm.

We also ran our Junior Youth Café session on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October for young people in school years 4-6. As well as lots of Halloween themed activities, and in partnership with Bike Active, we offered young people an opportunity to have a go on a range of adapted bikes on the multi-use games area next to The Pavilion.



We are always looking for new volunteers to help support and develop our offer to young people locally, so please get in touch if you have a few hours to spare and enjoy working alongside young people. We'd love to hear from you.

There are also additional activities for young people across South Norfolk to gain new experiences and develop practical skills and knowledge, including gaining accredited awards through the South Norfolk Youth Advisory Board's Autumn Activity Programme. After 4 years of helping to raise awareness of the plight of Hedgehogs in my local town, I spent lockdown wondering what more I could do to help our prickly pals.

My first project was born: The Hedgehogs R Us Highway Project!



# What is a Hedgehog Highway?

A Hedgehog Highway is a 5 inch gap in a fence or wall allowing access for Hedgehogs. Other names include 'Hedgehog Door', 'Hedgehog Hole' and 'Hedgehog Tunnel'.

These gaps are essential in the battle to prevent the extinction of our endangered spiky friends.

The Hedgehog Highway allows hedgehogs to:

- \* Forage for food
- \* Meet mates to breed
- \* Access nesting sites

Available to buy for £3 each at the Town Council office in the Pavilion!

### Why should I get a Hedgehog Highway Surround?

1. Hedgehog Highway Signs look super cute!

2. They raise awareness to hedgehogs' struggle for survival.

3. They create a talking point, encouraging others to create a highway of their own and take part in the project.

4. Money from the sale of every Hedgehog Sign is donated to help the rescue of sick and injured hedgehogs.
