I have written about Research in a past issue particularly about the importance of it and why we do it. In this issue I want to mention some of the ongoing Research studies our practice is involved in and some of you may have received invites to join studies. I lead the Research section in the practice. I am therefore involved in screening and finding the most appropriate patients for studies we are involved in.

A reminder about Research in healthcare. It lays the foundation for all advances in health and care and is the basis for evidence-based practice. Clinicians in the NHS practice evidence-based medicine. I do think that whatever we can contribute, however small will have an impact on the delivery of services and management of illnesses now for the future.

Ongoing studies:

- 1. Duration UTI study. This study is run by the clinical Trials unit, University of Oxford. It aims to find the shortest antibiotic duration needed to effectively treat Urinary Tract Infections in women. The study will also look at the impact of each antibiotic and treatment duration on antibiotic resistance in bacteria found in the patient's urine result. This is a randomised study. Resistance meaning that bacteria do not respond to certain antibiotics hence creating a major problem in delivering best practice of medicine.
- Who can participate: Adult women, aged 18 years or above, assigned female at birth and if the clinician determines the patient requires antibiotic for a suspected bladder or kidney infection.
- **2.** Asymptomatic study. This study is run by the University of Liverpool. This is a randomised controlled study assessing symptom driven vs preventer therapy for the outpatient management of Asthma in children. In simple terms in children with mild Asthma, is the preventer inhaler when taken at the time of symptoms as effective as when taken on a daily basis.
- Who can participate: Children between the ages of 5 and 15 who have mild Asthma. I will screen the eligibility based on the criteria of mild Asthma as set out by the study team.
- **3.** INDIGO Community study. This is being run by Imperial College London. This study aims to fill the gap in knowledge about cancer survivors. It looks at long term outcomes and service use of people living beyond cancer. It focuses on collecting Reported Outcome Measures and Patient Reported Experience measures from patients to better understand their health status and quality of life after treatment.

Who can participate: All patients over the age of 16 who have had any type of cancer in the past.

If you do receive an invite, please take time to read. However small our contribution may be, it all adds up to possibly creating a major change for someone we may or may not know now or in the future.

A word from Rosedale......

For some, the beginning of a new year can be a good time to make changes in life. A new year brings the possibility of a fresh start. Many people commit to new fitness or dietary goals or reassess career direction. In January, estate agents report a surge of properties coming onto the market as people decide to make changes to their living arrangements.

On a smaller scale, I like to take stock of my bookshelves, kitchen cupboards and wardrobe. There is something therapeutic about re-organising our personal space and clearing out things that are surplus to requirements. It feels good to donate clothes and books to charity shops, knowing that someone else can benefit from things we no longer need, whilst also making money for worthy causes. This form of recycling is also good for the planet.

For those who are bereaved, a new year is often not a cause for celebration but a reminder that the future must be faced without their loved one. For some, this fear can be quite overwhelming.

At our bereavement groups, we like to remind participants that they do still have a future (even though it might look very different to what they had planned.) None of us know the future or what good times may lie ahead.

We also remind our participants that they are still individuals of worth (even without their loved one) and they are still important - friends, family, colleagues etc, still need them.

No matter our circumstances, we all have something to offer. We each have a unique set of skills, characteristics and abilities that are needed in the world.

Most importantly, we all need to be reminded that we are not alone. Everyone is part of some kind of community, whether that be a family, a friendship group, neighbourhood, church, workplace or hobby club. At the most basic level, we are all part of the human race and have a part to play in making the world a better place.

I'll finish with a little story...... Whilst looking at some of the comments beneath an Instagram post about mental health, a doctor had commented that he was losing hope and didn't feel his life had a point anymore. I encouraged him to keep going and that I believed he had a unique combination of skills and abilities that no one else had. I reminded him that the world needed what he had to give. He replied with 'Thank you, I really needed to hear this today.'

We don't know what difficult situations someone else might be facing but we can all do a little something that might make a big difference- a smile, a helping hand, a kind word, or an act of generosity. 





15 of us met at the co-op car park, we piled into 4 cars and drove to Bedingham Village – parking on Church Road beside At Andrew's Church. Steven our leader said we would firstly walk 1 ½ miles along the road, so turning left the walk commenced. We passed Priory Farm and noted the sound of machinery from farm buildings – maybe a milking session was in progress? The "Silfield Herd" was signed. A kestrel was seen perched on a telegraph cable. As the walk proceeded the weather turned out very pleasant with

blue sky, sunshine, and mild in complete contrast to the frosty start of the day. Hedges and trees lined the road, as yet no sign of green leaves. We reached a junction and turned left into Dulgate Road. Another bird observation – this time a red kite flying high over a field; also seen was a marsh harrier. On the ground a clump of primroses gave us a promise of spring just around the corner. A field of sheep came into view but no lambs as yet –



perhaps they were imminent? Crows and rooks were heard cawing loudly overhead. We also noted a common gull sitting in a field and there was blackthorn with white blossoms in a hedgerow. On walking past Forsters' Farm we arrived at a junction and turned left into Upgate Street – carrying straight on, a type of wych elm was seen with buds forming



on its twigs. We stopped a while and looked across the fields to view "Spring Wood" on the horizon; at this point we were 3 miles from Hemphall. A house with a thatched roof and yellow painted walls looked picture perfect. As we walked on a pony over the hedge looked out at us as we walked by, his fur coat was very thick. In the next field a flock of black

sheep with lambs. Soon after these wonderful sights we turned left onto a concrete bridleway. A buzzard was seen flying overhead, skylarks were heard, and on



a stubble field were a flock of yellow hammers (seen by binoculars) – some 14 or 15 of them feeding on the spoils of last years harvest.

Throughout our walk clumps of snowdrops could be seen

in abundance along with some daffodils. The bridleway continued on then veered to the left and we then found ourselves on a mud track on the edge of a field. We then passed a rather unpleasant smell of slurry before reaching a road ,turning right things improved. We saw a clump of crocuses with purple/mauve coloured petals and orange stamens and a buff-tailed bumble bee was busy collecting pollen and nectar.

We passed an old school house. By this time Bedingham St Andrew's Church was visible; we approached it steadily on a descending twisting road and down further we turned left into Church Road. The walk concluded with a visit to the church, then we said our goodbyes. Thanks Steven for a lovely walk.
