**Temporary Traffic Restriction Order 2024  
Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, Section 16a as Amended by The Road  
Traffic Regulation (Special Events) Act 1994**

**In the Parish of Long Stratton  
On 10<sup>th</sup> November 2024**

**Temporary Restriction of Traffic Movement**

Norfolk County Council, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate the Long Stratton Remembrance Parade event, they intend to make a Traffic Order, the effect of which will be to temporarily restrict vehicular traffic on the 1) A140 Ipswich Road from its junction with C500 Flowerpot Lane to its junction with C355 Hall Lane; and 2) C500 Flowerpot Lane from its junction with A140 Ipswich Road to its junction with U76574 St Marys Road in the PARISH OF LONG STRATTON.

The Order will come into effect on 10<sup>th</sup> November 2024 and will remain in force for 30 minutes. The roads will be temporarily restricted (except for emergency and pedestrian access) between 10:50 and 11:20 on 10<sup>th</sup> November 2024 for the duration of the event. Restriction on traffic will only be enforced until normal traffic flow can be maintained.

Where appropriate during the period of the closure temporary suspension of existing permanent Traffic Orders may be imposed

Alternative route will be via: 1) N/A; 2) C500 Flowerpot Lane, U76249 Manor Road, C345 Swan Lane, A140 The Street

The promoter of the event is Long Stratton Town Council.
