The Patient Participation Group are meeting on Monday evening 17th February to discuss our next health education evening. The intention is that we will focus on the subject of "Heart Health," building on our Diabetes session held last year. We haven't settled on a date yet, but it will be during the spring (hopefully before Easter depending on venue availability).

This event ties in nicely with the recent news coverage about young people and heart health awareness as per this morning's article on the BBC News (Tuesday 4th February – which you can watch on iplayer).

Heart health affects everyone, no matter what age, and taking small steps to make lifestyle changes can dramatically improve your life. Your heart is a muscle that requires exercise and care, just as much as any other muscle!

The intention will be to have guest speakers from a range of services present. British Heart Foundation, a consultant from the cardiology team at the Norfolk & Norwich, and hopefully someone from a sport and nutrition background as well. The aim of the evening will be to help patients understand some of the more complex, but increasingly common terminology. To dispel some myths, and to open conversations about ways that you can take power over your own health. We will look to explore the complex world of cholesterol, statins, and have some dietary advice about balanced eating habits.

BIKE ACTIVE NORFOLK

As spring approaches, BikeActive Norfolk swings into," full on action", and March 2025 sees us running our adult disability cycling group weekly from Earsham village hall. By April 2025 we really hit the ground running, with weekly sessions of our adult group at Topcroft Sports and Social Club on alternate Fridays and Earsham Village Hall on alternate Mondays. Adult weekly running then continues through until the end of October 2025. If you are interested in riding with our adult group, for those with disability or recovering from illness or injury, take a look at our website, BikeActiveNorfolk.org to find out more and then get in touch

Wednesday the 9th of April 2025 sees the return of BikeActive Norfolk Junior group for children under eighteen with any disability. This allows these children to ride our trikes, recumbent trikes, go karts, quadracycles, or be piloted on our wheelchair tandem trike or rear steer or side by side tandem trikes, in the safe traffic free environment of the multi-use games area at Long Stratton, Manor Rd Park. The group runs in Norfolk school holidays and will run two forty-minute sessions between 1300hrs and 1340hrs, and 1340hrs to 1420hrs. We will then run from 1420hrs to 1500hrs, with the Long Stratton Youth Café. Long Stratton Youth Worker, Anastasia Twigg will help run this session with the Youth Café's young people. If you are the parent or carer of a child with any disability, please feel free to take a look at our website BikeActiveNorfolk.org accessing the Junior group part of the site and see what we do. If you are interested get in contact or book your child on a session. Parents or carers must remain at these sessions. There is a further session on Wednesday the 16th of April 2025 during Easter which will follow the same format.

BikeActive Norfolk is a wholly voluntary organisation, no one is paid, and we constantly need to raise funds and find volunteers. If you would like to do something which is very rewarding with a group of friendly volunteers and grateful clients, then come along or get in contact through the website. Not being a regular cyclist does not prohibit people being involved, so get in touch

Finally, our 2025 fund raising event will be an amazing 24hr go kart and recumbent trike endurance race on the multi-use games area at Long Stratton Manor Rd playing field. We are raising money for a Van Raam Chat rickshaw to be used in Long Stratton to transport disabled and older people to appointments at the Medical Centre, to the library, pharmacists or to visit friends within Long Stratton , after the bypass is complete and traffic volume in the centre of the town is much reduced. This electrical assist cycle is an expensive piece of equipment. But similar schemes in Thetford, Bury SE and Clacton have been hugely well received giving disabled people a low cost, environmentally friendly way to get around the town, and a similar scheme in Long Stratton would be a community asset. For our fundraiser to be successful we are asking that people in the village get involved in taking part and running this event. It is to the benefit of our community. They battle entrenched tradition and dare to place the fate of their farm in the hands of nature. Ripping down the fences, they set the land back to the wild and entrust its recovery to a motley mix of animals both tame and wild. It is the beginning of a grand experiment that will become one of the most significant rewilding experiments in Europe.

Student Results

We have recently received official confirmation that Long Stratton High School came in the top 5 secondary schools in Norfolk for 2024 GCSE results and in the last 3 years, we have placed 3rd, 10th, and 5th in Norfolk for student progress (out of more than 50 secondary schools).

The (Progress 8) score of +0.54 also puts us in the top 8.1% of secondary schools nationally (out of more than 5800 schools) and is categorised by the Department for Education as 'Well Above Average', the highest possible category. This means that because they attended Long Stratton High School, every student (on average) made more than half a grade of progress in every subject compared to their peers nationally. The national average is a score of -0.03. We know that there is far more to an education than grades but we also know that it is important to celebrate success and making excellent progress opens doors and gives young people opportunities they might not otherwise have. I am extremely proud of all members of our school community who work so hard every day to go above and beyond to support our young people. Maintaining this level of Achievement for All over time is very difficult and is testament to the dedication of all staff as well as the hard work of our students and the huge amount of support that families put in place. As a community, we can be tremendously proud of our young people.

Leading Parent Partnership Award

We are hugely committed to working with families to ensure we can support our young people in the best possible way and have recently started working towards a highly sought after award. Part of this is to look at and review how we work with families and the award focuses on a range of different objectives, including:

· Ensuring our school is a welcoming, friendly environment.

- · Ensuring high quality, frequent communication.
- Reviewing policies to ensure they are accessible to all.
- · Helping families to support their children with their learning.

· Facilitating opportunities for families to actively get involved with our school.

The Working Party (containing parents, staff, governors and a representative from the Town Council) has already met twice and we look forward to collaborating further and sharing our progress over the course of the year.




of Spring were all around. The carpets of snowdrops were amazing, though they were waiting for a bit more sun to open out fully. The aconites shone brilliantly.
